


Trinity College London Skills for Life Writing exams Guidance for Level 1 Task 4: Compose text message

4. Your friend is coming to visit you next month but you have an important work event. Write him/her a text message to rearrange the date.

Write about 30 words in your answer.



The length of the text, content and level of detail are mostly appropriate for the task, although it is too long. The candidate also uses appropriate language, e.g. *such a shame/ all the best,* with confidence and ease. The candidate scores 4 for both assessment criteria – 2.1: produce content appropriate to purpose, and 2.2: use appropriate language for a given task.

The answer is too long and has too much unnecessary and irrelevant detail. The candidate scores 2 for AC 2.1: Produce content appropriate to purpose.

The language is fairly consistent throughout the task, eg, *How you doing*. The candidate scores 3 for AC 2.2: Use appropriate language for a given task.

I'm so happy that you want come here but unfortunat I received a letter questioning from the company that I had to go there and months later Many thanks

The text message is appropriate to the purpose, but too detailed and over length. The candidate scores 3 for AC 2.1: Produce content appropriate to purpose.

The neutral register, mode of address and closure are appropriate for the task and there is an example of using a numeral. The candidate scores 3 for AC 2.2: Use appropriate language for a given task.
